

ROBIN ALLEY: This is Robin Alley from Langston Hughes Middle School and I am interviewing Pat MacIntyre on June 7, 2000 with the topic of current transportation.

RA: What kind of transportation do you use?

PAT MACINTYRE: Now I use my own car, and walk on paths.

RA: How do you get from home to work?

PM: By car.

RA: Why do you use the transportation alternative that you do?

PM: Well, my life is very fragmented...and, I need to run a lot of errands for my art and hang shows and...that has to be, kind of flexible.

RA: What is a typical day?

RA: (laughs) What forms of transportation are used by other people in the household?

PM: I guess everybody has their own cars now. My son has just graduated from George Mason and so he needed it to go to class. He often would ride with a buddy, or take a buddy, but mostly he needed the flexibility of a car. And even if we're both coming to the same destination, my husband is...the owner of the company, has often to play squash or some other sports after work, so he must have his own car. A lot of cars.
