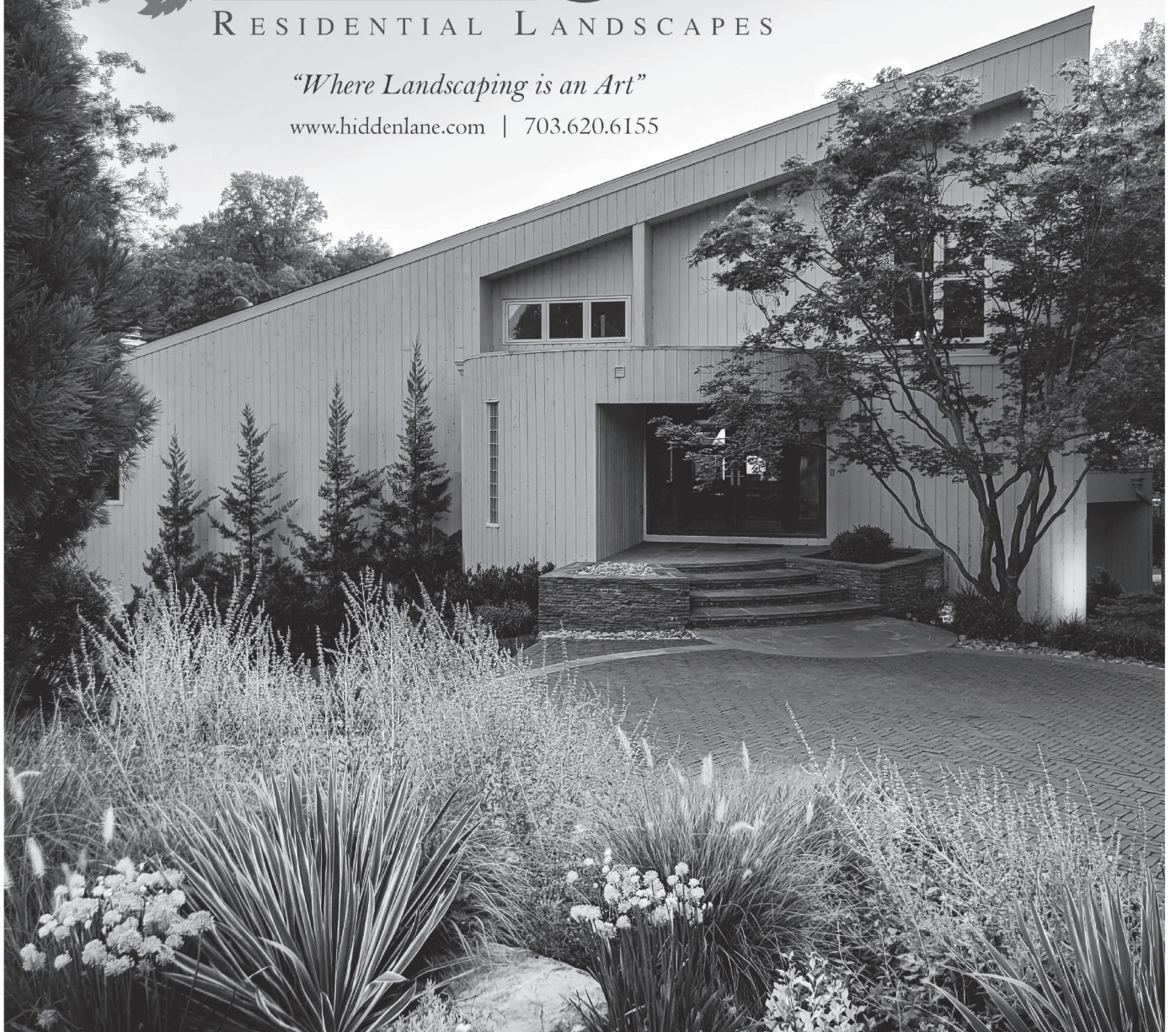

For those desiring a metropolitan lifestyle with suburban conveniences, The Townhomes at Reston Station offer an ideal place to call home. Just steps to the Wiehle-Reston East Metro Station, new shops and long-time favorite dining spots, as well as the far-reaching

W&OD Trail, these modern new townhomes will be bordered by urban parks and landscaped plazas and feature an onsite children's playground, bocce ball court, and more.

EYA specializes in creating sustainable new neighborhoods designed to foster a sense of community among new and long-time residents with onsite parks and gathering spaces to meet up with neighbors and friends. The Townhomes at Reston Station is an example of EYA's innovative approach to building urban neighborhoods within a suburban setting that offers homebuyers the best of *life within walking distance*[®] with easy access to trails, dining, shopping, Metro and more.

When completed, this new community will feature 115 new townhomes, available in three distinct home plans. The Anderson model features approximately 1,690 interior square feet, 3-4 bedrooms, and loft level with rooftop terrace. The Baker model is approximately 2,420 interior square feet, also offering 3-4 bedrooms and loft level with rooftop terrace, plus an entry-level home office and in-home private elevator. The Conrad is the largest model with approximately 2,570 interior square feet, 3 bedrooms on the upper level (with an optional multigenerational suite on the entry level), large rooftop terrace, and in-home private elevator. Two furnished model homes, the Anderson and the Baker, are available to tour daily by appointment, during weekend open house hours, and during the 2022 Reston Home Tour.

These homes feature brick facades, large windows, and open main-level floorplans. Interiors offer spacious 9-foot ceilings on all levels of the home and wide-plank flooring. The kitchens feature quartz countertops, stainless steel appliances, and optional Euro or Deluxe kitchen packages with Bosch appliances and cabinet-panel refrigerator and dishwasher doors. There are plenty of additional options, features, and finishes to suit each buyer's tastes.

Environmentally friendly features include tankless water heaters, low-flow fixtures, Energy Star appliances, low emittance windows, and LED bulbs throughout.

The community vision that inspired Reston has been expanded to Reston Station, with work well underway to create a new hub for retail, commercial, residents, and visitors to engage with convenient access to Metro, bus, and commuter routes as well as opportunities for biking, running, and walking.

For more than 30 years, EYA has been building new homes in walkable areas where homeowners can enjoy the best of *life within walking distance*[®]. EYA has welcomed residents to more than 45 neighborhoods across Washington, D.C., Maryland, and Northern Virginia, including nearby Mosaic District, as well as new EYA neighborhoods in Old Town Alexandria, Falls Church, and Fairfax in addition to Reston.

The Townhomes at Reston Station are priced from the mid \$800s, including a few homes available for 2022 move-in dates.

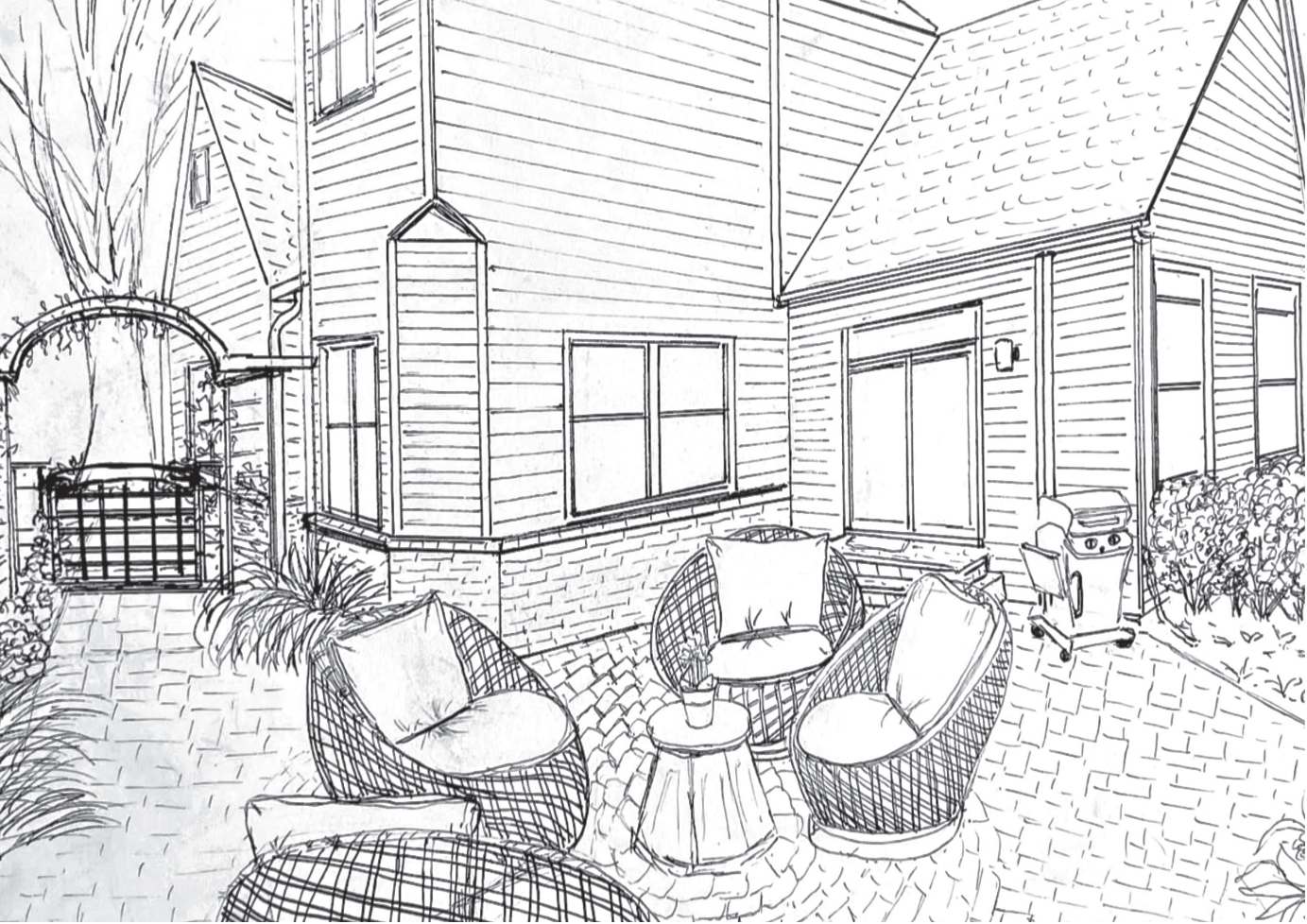

THE PEEBLES HOME

Home Facts

Address: 2011 Beacon Place

Style: Contemporary

Year: 1997

Jackie had lived in Reston for 25 years, but several years ago she needed a smaller house and garden to take care of. There was no way she was going to leave Reston—she has long valued its sense of community, the history of Lake Anne, and its environmental features—lakes, streams, ponds, and trails. After an extensive search, she found Beacon Place and the perfect house for her (and Chance, her Airedale).

The house, built in 1997, was just the right size—three bedrooms, two and a half baths, and an unfinished basement (great for storage,

but no need to furnish). And Jackie loved the ample windows, tall ceilings, and sense of space. However, what really sold her on the house was the private, spacious back yard with its gardens, pond and water feature. They sold the house. Jackie saw the back yard before she went in the front door, and she told her realtor, “I want to live here.” Although the house backs up to Twin Branches Road, the yard feels intimate and private.

Jackie didn’t have to do any drastic remodeling to suit her tastes, but she did change the color of the kitchen countertops and cabinets and installed a farmhouse sink (from Home Depot). She had Custom Tile Design gut and remodel the master bathroom, which features a spacious shower and vanity. Jackie had ElevationBuild replace all the windows in the house.

She worked with Burgess Interiors to help with draperies, carpets, ceiling lights (chandeliers and downstairs hallway), furniture placement and new pieces to fit new house, floor lamps, bookcase design, and library design. She repurposed the living room into a library and added bookshelves from Treowen Woodworking to house her collection of books on art, history, and antiquities. She changed the formal dining room to a sitting room, as all meals are served informally at the country kitchen table (found on Etsy). The fireplace in the family room has been faux painted by Lenore Winters Studio. Many items of furniture, including those in the upstairs bedrooms, came from Jackie’s prior home. (The linear walk-in closet in the master bedroom was original to the house.)

The home is notable for its artwork and sculptures, which are in all rooms. Many of the paintings and drawings were done by her late husband when he was an art student in his late fifties, first at NOVA, then at the Corcoran School of Art. The standing nude figure was purchased at an American University art student show. Some items were purchased at the Reston Art Festival, including the

stunning landscape on the stairwell wall, painted by David Cochran. Another David Cochran, “Two Women,” graces the library wall. In the master bedroom are a nude painted by John Bannon; a landscape of Portofino by Rose Marie Schmidt, and Pam Burch’s painting of Jackie’s late husband Wes.

The Peebles traveled widely and collected as they went. Some of the items in Jackie’s home were gathered during their travels—for example, the jade elephant in the sitting room is from Vietnam; the carved figures on the family room mantel are from Dar-es-salaam; the pottery is from Greece; small antiquities on the library bookshelves are from tombs in Mesopotamia, as is a reproduction of a Tang Dynasty wine cup from the Shanghai Museum. The carpet in the family room was purchased in Istanbul, and other area rugs in Antalya. The tapestry in the sitting room is French.

The back yard and garden—in Jackie’s words, what sold the house—is an enclosed oasis of beauty, with a large cherry tree, maple tree, and junipers. Outside the family room is a patio of pavers with four chairs arranged in a circle. Here one can listen to the water that flows into the pond all year ‘round. The new fencing keeps out noise from Twin Branches Road. Jackie used Meriwether Designs to add plantings to the front and back yards, enhancing the existing garden beds.

Jackie’s “new” home is a wonderful space to entertain (Jackie hosts three bridge groups each week). The house has become a family gathering place, as her children and grandchildren live in the area. Memorable to all was celebrating the first Covid Christmas outdoors in the back garden area, surrounded by fire pits and gas heaters. The family was all together for the first time in four years.

THE GUPTA HOME

Home Facts

Address: 11925 Triple Crown Road

Style: Custom modern

The home the Guptas purchased in 1998 was a far cry from the modern masterpiece it is today. Built in 1986, the house was dark inside, inefficiently designed, and barren of landscaping. Shashi and Margaret began renovations by enlarging the mudroom, which led to a two-year redesign of the entire house.

The Guptas gutted the house interior and started over, reconfiguring the front entrance, and adding a two-story addition and large deck to the back. They opened the house to natural light through skylights in the two-story foyer. The living room is separated from the foyer by an etched back-painted low iron glass “wall” by artist Laurel Fyfe of Fox Fire Glass Galleries that

catches the light, allowing it to enter the room on the other side.

The living room, with its sectional sofas, features a stunning suspended sculpture. Called “Allegro,” designed by Rob Fisher, it is pieces of anodized perforated aluminum along dangling stainless steel bead chains, all set against a wall of brilliant sea-blue Venetian plaster. The sculpture was featured in *American Art Collector*, a juried competition of New York. Recessed sliding glass doors lead from here to a music room and office.

The Guptas’ spacious kitchen has a large island where family and friends can gather. The kitchen cabinets, which are wenge wood by Bulthaup, enclose pull-out shelving for pantry storage. There are no

overhead cabinets in the kitchen; instead, cookware, utensils, and food items are stored in the cabinets below the island and countertops.

Shashi and Margaret love the sunroom, which is a two-story addition with floor-to-ceiling glass, with a xeriscape rooftop garden. This room, where they enjoy most of their meals, holds one of their favorite pieces: a bronze-finished ceramic urn that they purchased from a potter in a small village in India. The chocolate window shades, which are activated by the push of a button, shut out the sun's heat while allowing a clear view of the woods out back.

The house has six bedrooms and five and a half baths. The master bedroom suite features a bed and floating side tables that Shashi designed. Remembering a visit to Sea Lounge on a trip to Mumbai years ago, Shashi duplicated the seafoam green color throughout the suite. The master bath has back-painted glass countertops, a huge walk-in shower with iridescent glass tiles, and a free-standing tub. All the other bathrooms in the house have limestone floors and use river rock in the showers.

The lower level of the house is largely taken up by a theater room with seven comfortable viewing chairs and screen, and an exercise room. The latter, thoroughly equipped with exercise machinery, offers floor-to-ceiling views of the back yard and a large area for yoga. There are two bedrooms in the lower level, one of which has Japanese rice-paper sliding doors along one wall that hide a desk area and closets within.

The Guptas have carefully selected each element of their home. From the recessed toe kicks (instead of baseboards) to the careful execution of the quarter-sawn oak and glass stairway, this home was planned with care, and little was left to chance. This thoughtful construction has produced a clean, uncluttered, and exciting space. The house is also a "smart home," in that the electricity, water, shades,

TV, and music can all be controlled remotely via phone. The Guptas can be in California, for example, and turn the air conditioning in the house down, should they so choose.

Shashi and Margaret have added extensive landscaping, both to the front and back of the house, some quite recently. The entrance to their circular drive is framed on each side by three holly trees, and boxwoods line the drive itself. The steps to the front door lead to a deck made of Tennessee flagstone, bordered by two Japanese maples and plantings laid out in a rectilinear pattern that complements the clean lines of the house.

From the three-car garage (with glass doors), one enters the back yard via large stone steps that lead to a rectangular reflecting pool outside the exercise room. The sculpture at the end of the reflecting pool—colorful panels made of powder-coated aluminum—is a special piece that the Guptas found on a driving trip through Woodstock, New York. They were able to convince the artist Shelley Parriott to come to Virginia and stay overnight with them to install it herself.

Alongside the stone steps that lead to the reflecting pool is an organic stone drainage system. This adds balance to the orthogonal pattern of the grassy backyard, which has been broken into three rectangular units separated by stone pavers. The backyard connects through a pathway to the Glade stream valley and Reston's extensive trail system.

In 2011, a year after the Guptas' home was first on the Reston Home Tour, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors gave the house an Exceptional Design Award. Indeed, this home is truly exceptional—not just for Reston but for all of Virginia.

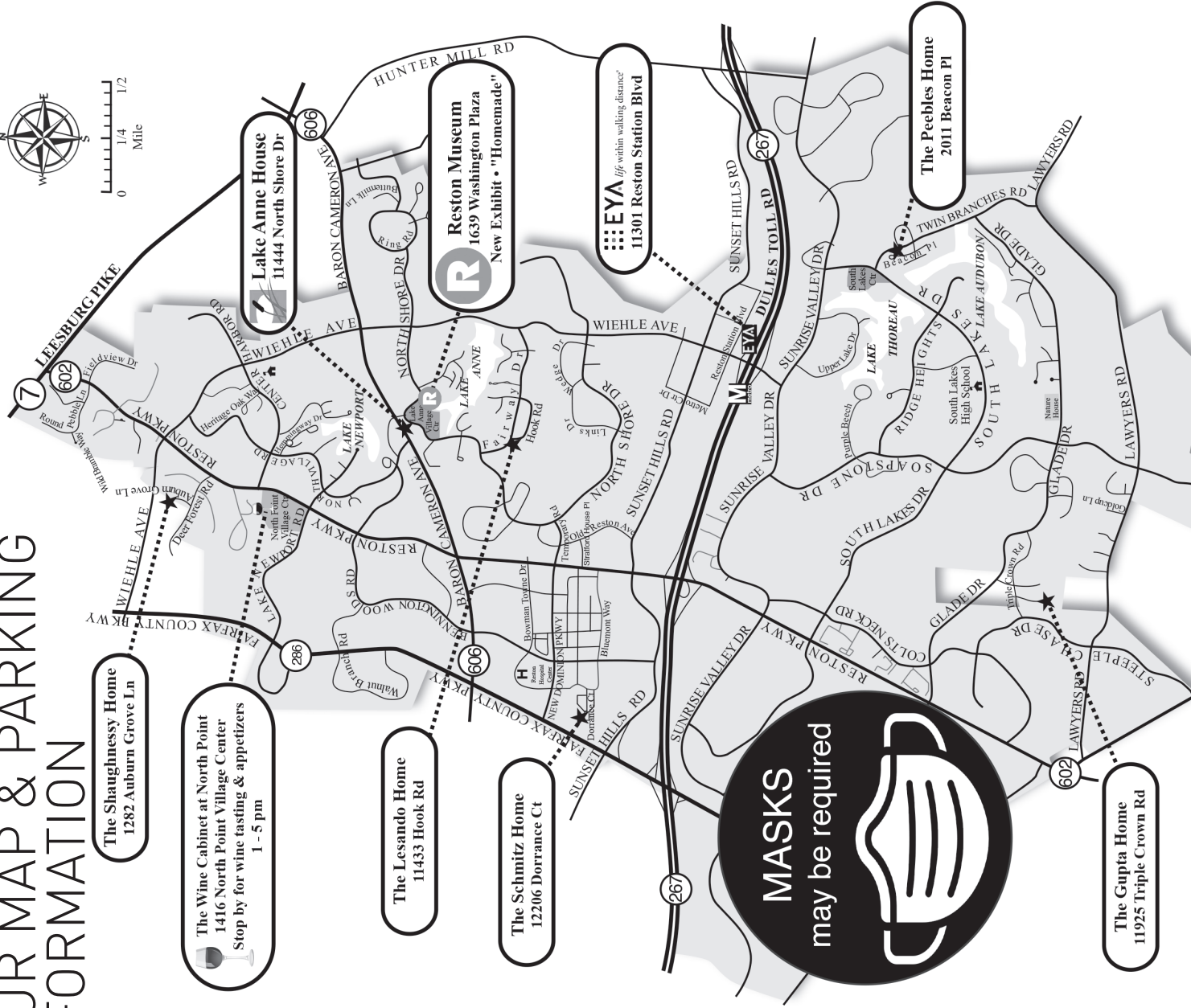

EYA BUILDERS—11301 RESTON STATION BLVD

From the intersection of Rte 267 and Wiehle Ave, travel north on Wiehle Ave, turn right on Sunset Hills Rd, and then right on Michael Faraday Dr, arriving at a four-way stop. The new townhouses are on your right. Parking is available on Michael Faraday and Reston Station Blvd.

THE PEBBLES HOME—2011 BEACON PLACE

Return to and turn left on Wiehle Ave, crossing over the Toll Rd, turn left on Sunrise Valley Dr and then right on South Lakes Dr. Turn left at the first stop light on Twin Branches Rd. Beacon Ridge is on the right, and Beacon Place is the next right. NOTE: Parking on Twin Branches is strongly advised.

THE GUPTA HOME—11925 TRIPLE CROWN ROAD

Return to Twin Branches, turn right. Immediately after you pass Lake Audubon turn right on Glade Dr, and, after crossing Soapstone, turn left on Triple Crown Rd to house on the left. Parking is available on Triple Crown and at the Pony Barn Park across the street.

THE SCHMITZ HOME—12206 DORRANCE COURT

Continue on Triple Crown, turning right on Steeplechase Dr. Turn right on Colts Neck, then left on Glade Dr to Reston Parkway. Turn right, heading north on the parkway. Turn left on Bluemont Way, which becomes Crescent Park Dr, then turn left on Logan Manor Dr and then left on Dorrance Ct. Parking is available in front of the house.

THE LESANDO HOME—11433 HOOK ROAD

Return to Reston Parkway and head north. Turn right on Temporary Rd, and left on North Shore Dr. Turn right on Fairway Dr and again right on Hook Rd to house on the corner. Parking is available along Fairway and Hook.

LAKE ANNE HOUSE—11444 NORTH SHORE DRIVE

Return to and turn right on North Shore Dr. Lake Anne House is on the left at the intersection with Fellowship Square. Parking is available on North Shore Dr, and, after 12 noon, when the Reston Farm Market closes, in the Lake Anne Village parking lot across the street.

From the North Shore Drive three-way stop, turn left and then left again on Baron Cameron Ave. Turn right on Reston Parkway, then left on Deer Forest Rd and right on Auburn Grove La. Parking is available on the street.

THE SCHMITZ HOME

Only a stone's throw away from the heart of Reston Town Center and the new Reston Metro station, West Market is a community of townhouses and condominiums that reflect a European urban elegance. Here Ted and Erica Schmitz found an ideal place to live.

They both grew up in Fairfax County and lived in Vienna for years on a half-acre lot, where they raised their two daughters. When the girls were college age, they wanted to move to a smaller place in a more "urban" location. They considered the Boro but decided they didn't want to live in a high-rise condo. They found the West Market area of Reston and in 2018 purchased the house on Dorrance Court, built in 1998 by Christopher Companies. They liked the proximity to Reston Town Center and the Metro, as well as the green space and access to trails, with the W&OD practically in their back yard.

For two years they rented out the house. When the tenants' lease expired in 2021, the Schmitzes began renovations on the house. They wanted to open up the main floor to create one large space. They also wanted to upgrade the bathrooms, and change out paint colors, flooring, carpeting, and light fixtures. Working with Design Pro Remodeling and Amy Gay of Amora Home, these renovations were completed within two months, and they moved in at the end of October 2021.

Originally the main floor had a wall that separated the living and dining area from the kitchen area in the back of the house, and the dining area was formal. Ted and Erica removed the separating wall to create one large airy living space. They removed an existing fireplace and installed a ventless fireplace by Hearth Cabinet in the living room area; their carpenter framed it, surrounded it with marble, and built a custom mantel.

The Schmitzes installed all new tile flooring (which is heated!); and they converted the former dining room to an informal sitting area. The dining area next to the kitchen has a custom tray ceiling

effect and a new chandelier. The dining area wall features a multiple panel piece by Shannon Foeller-Valley Ridge Fine Art. The powder room has unique floral wallpaper, and the fixtures have all been upgraded. (All the bathroom floors have heated tile.) Near the front door is a piece of hand-carved porcelain by Jarjour Pottery from Shippensburg, Pennsylvania, that Erica bought at the Reston Arts Festival last fall.

The kitchen had been upgraded by the house's prior owners, so Ted and Erica left it intact except for new hardware. The kitchen area with its large windows opens to the back deck and provides a view of the retention pond and surrounding greenery.

Upstairs the house has three bedrooms—one for each daughter and the master bedroom facing the pond. The master bedroom used to have open areas near the ceiling where decorative items or plants could be featured, but Ted and Erica converted them to storage areas for Christmas decorations, suitcases, and the like. The bathrooms have both been remodeled. The stair runner and upstairs carpeting are both wool blends sourced through Farsh Carpets in Alexandria.

Downstairs is a large recreation room with comfortable sofa, TV, and desk area. Here the back doors lead to a stone-paved enclosed patio that has been newly landscaped by Meadows Farms. Out the back gate one can walk to the path that borders the pond and leads to other parts of the West Market neighborhood.

With large windows on both sides of the house, a water view, and the soft, clean blue colors of the living space, the Schmitz's home feels like a beach house. It provides a wonderful balance of urban living in the suburbs: proximity to Metro, shopping and dining—with the feel of nature, water and green space.

Matt Lesando, whose family owns the Santini's restaurants, and is an avid golfer. Thus, he was very attracted to the house on Hook Road, as it is right next to the Hidden Creek Golf Course, which forms a view of the fourteenth green over the back yard. He also liked the split-level style. The house had been built in 1967 and over the years there had been some improvements, mainly on the inside, but Matt had a vision of much more. When he bought the house in 2015, he had lots of ideas on how to improve its overall appearance. Over the last seven years he has tackled one renovation project after another,

most of them of his own design. He began with the front and back yards, where he redid the landscaping and installed an irrigation system.

The signature feature of Matt's house is the spacious kitchen and sitting area that opens to the outdoor patio through triple 12-foot sliding glass doors that slide to open eight feet. The patio, all 1,500 feet of it, has a view of the golf course over the back yard. It features a fire pit, hot tub, built-in grill, and large-screen TV. There is also a turf-covered area for Matt's dogs (including a large fire hydrant), as well as a dog door to the inside and a pot filler by the fireplace for their water bowl. The fire pit area is covered with a wing-shaped awning that was designed to be a double carport. The gated patio is bordered with gray stone pillars and black railing.

Matt renovated the kitchen area in 2021. Here he took down existing walls and filled in an outdated step-down pit at the end of the room. He installed Thermador appliances, a wine cooler, and custom cabinetry and countertops. The stone kitchen table from Arhaus forms the centerpiece of the large kitchen room. The large wooden dog crate in the kitchen area is an attractive piece of furniture.

Where there was once a long wall between the kitchen and living room, Matt created large openings to provide light and a sense of space. The living room, with its large sectional sofa, and sunken dining room have been decorated in grays and blues. The art glass panels on the walls of the kitchen area and dining room came from Wayfair. Here, as throughout the house, the windows and plantation shutters, paint colors, lighting, and chair rails are all new.

The master bedroom features a built-in wall-length custom dresser and a custom walk-in closet where there was once a sitting room, both designed by *Tailored Living*. Matt refinished and stained the hardwoods, changing the color from natural to a modern gray. There are two other bedrooms on the main floor, one of which Matt uses as his office.

The basement, which was unfinished when Matt bought the house, now features a theater room with large-screen TV and eight leather reclining chairs with cup holders, phone chargers and tray tables. And the adjacent kitchenette provides space to prepare drinks and popcorn for viewers. There is a fourth bedroom in the basement as well, which Matt uses as an exercise room, and another full bath.

In 2017 Matt decided to expand and remodel the unfinished garage. The area now includes a huge 17-foot single glass garage door, brightly colored walls, and checkered finished floor. The garage stores Matt's car, tools and hardware, a full-size refrigerator/freezer, and personal custom golf cart that he uses to play golf at Hidden Creek Country Club.

With its open floor plan, unique garage, and expansive patio, Matt's personal "club house" is an ideal party location. Parties seem to happen often after a round of golf with Matt's buddies. A bachelor, Matt confesses to spending lots of time in his hot tub, no matter the weather. As he says, there is "nothing like the snow falling and watching the Monday night football game from there." He hosted an "after party" following a recent high school reunion, which was held at the Hidden Creek Golf Course next door.

The two buildings that made up the Lake Anne Fellowship House, with affordable apartments for seniors, were constructed in the early 1970s. Forty-five years later, the buildings were in serious need of repair. It was deemed more cost effective to build an entirely new structure than to retrofit the existing buildings. Working with Grimm + Parker Architects, Charles P. Johnson & Associates, Orr Partners and Bozzuto Construction, Enterprise Community Development and Fellowship Square took an innovative development approach and constructed the new building on an underutilized portion of the site, adjacent to the original Lake Anne Fellowship House. Residents were provided relocation support and moved from the original building to the new Lake Anne House in phases over the summer. The now vacant circa-1970 buildings on the east half of the site will be demolished in 2023 and the land will be sold for future townhomes.

The new Lake Anne House provides affordable housing for more than 300 seniors aged 62 and older and offers 240 tax-credit affordable units with multiple subsidy programs. Residents pay anywhere between 30 and 60 percent of their annual income for rent, depending on the subsidy program they are affiliated with. Residents also receive support from donated

funds through Fellowship Square, which jointly owns the new Lake Anne House with its partner Enterprise Community Development.

The building includes 56 studios, 178 one-bedroom and six two-bedroom apartments and is a dramatic upgrade from the prior Fellowship House. It is much more energy efficient, being both Earthcraft and Energy Star certified. The open lobby and spacious lounge, designed by Aumen Asner, are full of light and beautifully decorated in soft green, blue, and tans, to reflect the theme of Lake Anne. The carpet in front of the large TV has a tree-branch pattern that brings nature inside. The décor reflects ideas from the residents themselves, who were provided opportunities to express what they wanted the space to look like. There are comfortable seats, plenty of tables, and a kitchen area for hosting group events.

A range of amenities are incorporated—again, provided in consideration of residents' input—including an arts and crafts room; and a gym with treadmills, bicycles, and weights; a game room with ping-pong table and computers; an arts and crafts room; a social service office; a wellness center for visiting medical professionals; a sun room; and a social hall on the basement floor for large gatherings. One of the most valued amenities is the large outdoor plaza with tables, chairs arranged in conversation clusters, and rocking chairs. There is a sleek modern fountain and raised garden beds where the residents can grow their own produce.

Each residential unit has a fully equipped kitchen with GE stove, dishwasher, refrigerator, and microwave, as well as a pantry. The ceilings are high, and the units are open between the kitchen and living area. There is luxury vinyl tile throughout each apartment and tile flooring in the bathrooms. All tubs and showers have grab bars. Some units have walk-in closets, and most have Juliet balconies with sliding doors. The units have overhead lighting and are cable-ready. Each of the seven floors has a laundry room with brand new washer-dryers.

Lake Anne House has a convenient on-site parking lot and garage parking, as well as electrical vehicle charging stations. It offers a passenger bus service to take residents on scheduled daily trips to nearby stores, restaurants, and events. A full social calendar of activities and programs provides opportunities to get involved in the Reston community.

With all these luxury features, it is no wonder that Lake Anne House is extremely popular and highly valued by its residents.

When Deirdre and TJ moved to Reston from New York City in 2001, they first settled on Great Owl Circle; four years later they moved to the house on Auburn Grove Lane. At that time, the main floor of the house, which was built in 1986, was broken into discrete rooms separated by walls, and the kitchen was highly inefficient. But they loved the neighborhood and location near their old home grounds and North Point shopping center.

Over the years they made a few changes to the house. In 2017 they replaced the wood siding with Hardiplank and installed new

windows. In 2018 they added a beautiful patio and a large Trex deck made by Mark Shriner. In January 2021, Deirdre and TJ began a full renovation of the main floor. For six months the family lived in a nearby townhouse until the house was ready, and moved back in during July 2021.

MAC Design + Build oversaw the renovations. On the main level walls were removed, the rooms were interconnected into one flowing space, and the kitchen was completely redone. The warm honey-colored pine plank flooring, which came from a building in Marshall, Virginia, was original to the house, and remained; new hardwood flooring was extended into the kitchen.

The living areas on the southwest side of the house offer comfortable seating arrangements and include a sofa and recliner from Room and Board in D.C. In the entryway to the living room is a large armoire from TJ's aunt that holds Deirdre's beloved Waterford crystal and dishes she accumulated from her former life in Brooklyn. The family room focuses on a large-screen TV over the fireplace with floating shelves on either side. The fireplace brick wall was painted white. LED lighting is recessed all along the back wall of the house.

The centerpiece of the renovated kitchen is a large island in white silestone with a JennAir induction cooktop at one end. The kitchen includes a convection oven, microwave, and warming drawer; a wine refrigerator; and a deep Uvati sink. The cabinets and wall tiles are all white, presenting a clean, pristine look. The walk-in pantry used to be a powder room. Adjoining the kitchen is a bumped-out glass sun room where TJ likes to have his coffee.

The mudroom leading into the house from the garage used to be a laundry room (the washer and dryer were moved upstairs). One wall has horizontal white paneling, and the floor is a striking black and white tile. Adjacent is a small powder room.

The dining room has a large table that Deirdre and TJ bought from an Amish wood maker as the first piece of furniture for their new life in Reston. The Mexican mirror is a gift from TJ's aunt. It is centered on a striking dark blue wall that has been subtly framed into squares. The carpet on the dining room floor comes from Ballard Designs.

Upstairs the house has four bedrooms and two full baths. Renovations here include the laundry room; an improved bathroom for the children; a large, new master bath; and all new hardwood flooring throughout. The children's bathroom has white subway tiles with black grout and a black and white tile floor—reminiscent of New York City, where Deirdre and TJ used to live. The master bath has a “European wet room,” which includes both a wall shower and free-standing tub, with a skylight and window. The toilet/bidet are hidden in their own enclosed room.

With their family and many friends, Deirdre and TJ like to entertain. Their newly renovated home—with its spacious kitchen, flowing spaces, comfortable furniture, and warm, simple décor—is an ideal place to host intimate gatherings and large parties alike.

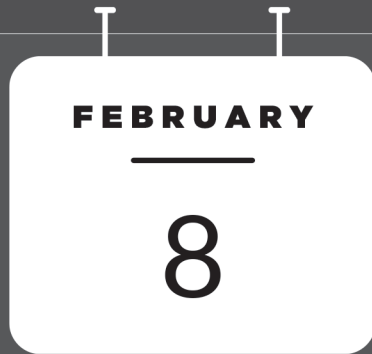

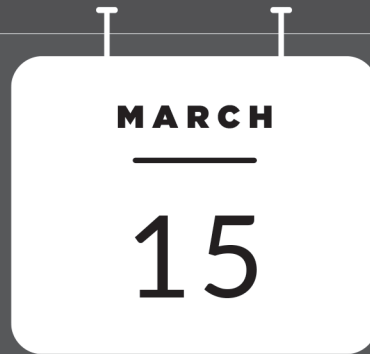
